The MYP approach to assessment varies in that the students are assessed on a set of four criteria. The four criteria in each of the MYP courses are weighted equally and are valued at 100% of the final grade. Formative assessments are reported and recorded in Campus, but are not factored into final grade. The criteria above represent the holistic nature of the IB-MYP.

CRITERIA- RELATED ASSESSMENT

The students are assessed on MYP criteria as well as state standards.

FORMATIVE AND SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT

Formative assessments are used in the instructional part of each unit to inform students and teachers about the students' understanding. Formative assessments are considered practice and help us to understand how the student is progressing in each criteria.

Summative assessments are given at the end of a learning period to allow students to demonstrate what they know. **The summative assessments will be used to determine the student grade. (Final grades will not include formative scores).**

REASSESSMENTS, LATE WORK AND ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

Wherever possible within a semester, teachers will create a pathway to allow students to improve their knowledge, understanding of concepts or skills and re-assess to show their new learning.

Late work and academic dishonesty will result in alternative consequences.

ASSESSMENT VARIATIONS

Assessment practices vary in all subject areas and include such tasks as: performances, projects, essays, exams, oral presentations, investigations, interviews, skits, simulations, exhibits, data analysis, and debates.

DIFFERENTIATION

Teachers modify tasks in product, process, or content to provide varying levels of learning.

SELF-EVALUATION

Students will be given opportunities to self-assess. Students should be able to communicate their strengths, areas for improvement, and the next steps in their learning.

RECORDING AND REPORTING OF GRADES

Teachers record the students' assessment results on Campus. Students, families, staff, and teachers have rights to access Campus.
